

## BEGINNERS I - 101 / BEGINNERS II - 102

The beginners level introduces students to both the spoken and written forms of the English language using today's most modern methods. Students are given opportunities to practice speaking, listening, reading and writing in the classroom and through interactive activities online and in the classroom.

## INTERMEDIATE I - 201 / INTERMEDIATE II - 202

The intermediate level continues to give students ample opportunities to improve their English abilities in speaking and listening, and introduces students to the basics of academic reading and writing. Students will be given instruction on the basics of reading, such as how to find main ideas, skimming and finding context clues. Writing at this level focuses on developing paragraphs with appropriate thesis statements and following the academic writing process such as introduction, body and conclusion.

### ADVANCE I - 301 / ADVANCE II - 302

The advance level strives to enhance students English abilities in speaking, listening, reading and writing. Students are exposed to common idiomatic expressions, both in spoken and written forms. Students are also introduced to reading academic research and writing. Student will have the opportunity to research a topic, and write about that topic. Students at this level learn how to find and cite sources for their research papers. This level appropriately prepares students for entry into any college in the United States.

## TOEFL

Test of English as a Foreign Language

### COURSE DESCRIPTION

The TOEFL® iBT test measures students' ability to use and understand English at the university level. It evaluates how well the students combine their listening, reading, speaking and writing skills to perform academic tasks. TOEFL preparation course in Columbia College is designed to obtain the planned TOEFL score within 10 weeks. It covers for all the areas in TOEFL® iBT and is designed with three important elements for the success in TOEFL: problem solving principle, practice and review, and necessary resources.

- To pass relevant coursework with a successful grade, students are required to:
  - A. maintains satisfactory attendance (80%);
  - B. participates in the class work including presentations and assignment;
  - C. obtains a passing grade (C or better).

# ACADEMIC WRITING AND DISCUSSION COURSE

This course is designed to improve writing effectiveness. Students will be required to expand their writing skills learned in ESL 301 and apply these skills to selected writing assignments. They will continue to study various rhetorical patterns and use their writing skills to develop essays in these patterns. The rhetorical patterns studied in this course are process analysis, cause and effect, and argument/persuasion. Students will also learn the process and skills needed to write a clear, precise, and accurate term paper.
