Course Description

This course is designed to improve writing effectiveness. Students will be required to expand their reading and writing skills learned in ESL 301 and apply these skills to selected writing assignments. They will continue to study various rhetorical patterns and use their writing skills to develop essays in these patterns. The rhetorical patterns studied in this course are process analysis, cause and effect, and argument/persuasion. Students will also learn the process and skills needed to write a clear, precise, and accurate term paper. Prerequisite: ESL301 or equivalent.

Learning Objectives and Goals

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

A. Read and understand the main ideas and supporting details of a short newspaper article

B. Read and understand the main ideas and supporting details of a general interest topic academic passages ranging from two to three pages long

C. Write a brief summary of a simplified academic text

D. Write a timed comparison/contrast essay, which includes a general to specific introduction, supporting body paragraphs, specific to general conclusion, and simple transitions

E. Write a timed cause/effect essay, which includes a general to specific introduction, supporting body paragraphs, specific to general conclusion, and simple transitions

F. Write a timed descriptive essay, which includes a general to specific introduction, supporting body paragraphs, specific to general conclusion, and simple transitions

G. Read for a variety of purposes, which includes gathering information, following directions, giving a response, forming an opinion, and understanding information.

H. Write to communicate ideas effectively.

I. Write conclusions about the author's message, values, and craft.

J. Associate what is being read with personal experiences and make connections.

K. Use the process and skills needed to write a clear and organized term paper or essay.
