The TOEFL® iBT test measures students' ability to use and understand English at the university level. It evaluates how well the students combine their listening, reading, speaking and writing skills to perform academic tasks. TOEFL preparation course in Columbia College is designed to obtain the planned TOEFL score within 10 weeks. It covers for all the areas in TOEFL® iBT and is designed with three important elements for the success in TOEFL: problem solving principle, practice and review, and necessary resources.

*To pass relevant coursework with a successful grade, students are required to:

A. maintains satisfactory attendance (80%);

B. participates in the class work including presentations and assignment;

C. obtains a passing grade (C or better).
